Introduction

In the reading from the Acts of the Apostles Jesus is compared to the keystone, or cornerstone rejected by the builders. This stone is most often the large stone placed in the foundation at the principal corner of a building. Most biblical references are metaphorical. Job 38:6, sees God as creator laying a cornerstone on which to "construct the world". The cornerstone of Psalm 118:22 is either Israel or its king, rejected as insignificant by the nations but exalted by God. In Isaiah 28:16, God lays a cornerstone in Zion, and this cornerstone is often taken to mean the announcement of salvation or a reference to the faith of the renewed Israel. In the later New Testament writings this tradition is continued by comparing Jesus, the Messiah, to the cornerstone, creating something new, bringing salvation and leading people to renewed faith in God.


